Located on the Foothill's Campus on the west side of Fort Collins, the lab's services include comprehensive breeding, foaling, assisted reproduction, and stallion services as well as courses on reproduction techniques and management.

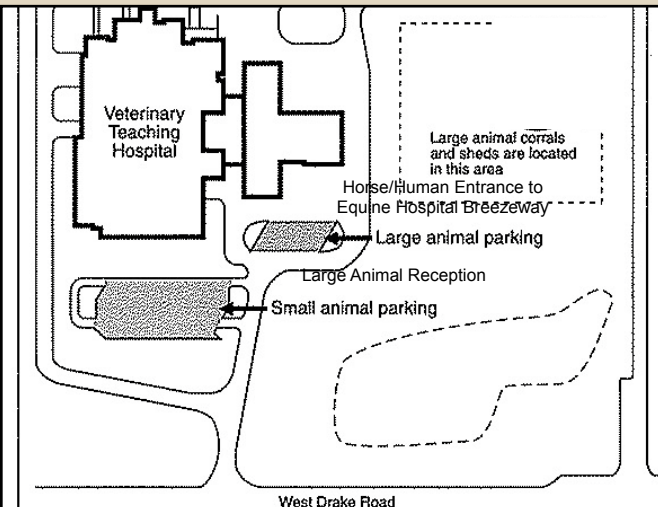

EXPERT SERVICES

As the most comprehensive hospital in the region, we provide full-service veterinary care from preventative health and wellness to more complicated diagnostic and surgical procedures.



Emergency and Critical Care is available 24/7 to treat problems from colic to lacerations and joint infections in horses of any age including newborns and foals. Treatment is supported by a fully-equipped adult intensive care unit (ICU), a neonatal ICU, and a fully staffed, on-demand surgical team including board-certified experts from our other service units.

Internal Medicine experts offer therapeutic expertise with the advanced capability of performing in-depth examinations to evaluate and treat medical problems from neurologic concerns to infectious and contagious disease to problems associated with aging.

Lameness and Surgery specialists provide expertise in all aspects of diagnosis and treatment of lameness/performance problems including advanced and complementary therapies driven by world-renowned orthopaedic research. In-house farrier services or consultation with your farrier is also available to provide corrective shoeing support.

We combine dedicated, expert care, innovative research, and modern diagnostic tools and equipment to evaluate and treat any situation that requires veterinary care for your horse. You can expect high-quality veterinary service and compassionate care from diagnosis to treatment to discharge.



Reproduction specialists offer comprehensive reproduction services supported by research that has led to advanced techniques used throughout the breeding industry. Most reproductive services are provided at the Equine Reproduction Laboratory on the Foothills Campus. Services at the hospital mainly focus on diagnostic tests on mares with potential ovarian or uterine abnormalities, evaluations of selected medical problems of stallions, and assistance with difficult births or dystocias.

Equine Field Service offers 24/7 care at your facility from general vaccination and wellness to emergency procedures with advanced diagnostic equipment, including digital radiography and ultrasound.

Complementary therapy including acupuncture, manipulative therapy, and massage are also available to help treat your horse.

Specialty consultations are also available with experts in cardiology, dermatology, and ophthalmology.

CONVENIENT FACILITY

The most advanced diagnostic and treatment tools in a convenient facility support our team of veterinary experts as they evaluate, diagnose, and treat your horse.



The Equine Hospital facility includes:

- Adult ICU stalls and mare-foal NICU stalls equipped with sling capabilities and the latest technology and monitoring equipment, including access to 24-hour clinical pathology and chemistry blood analysis, specialized fluid delivery devices, and ventilator capabilities for neonates. Individual video monitoring of colic aisle and isolation stalls is also available via the Internet.
- Three surgery suites outfitted with the latest tools to perform essentially any type of minor or complicated surgery.
- Board-certified anesthesiologists assist surgery teams and oversee care during surgical procedures.
- Multiple induction and recovery stalls including a padded neurology stall for management of horses waking from surgery.
- A separate isolation facility for treating horses with infectious/contagious diseases, so that we can provide the best care and keep other patients safe.
- A covered lameness examination area, an exercise arena, and a high-speed treadmill for evaluating lameness and performance problems.

ADVANCED IMAGING

The latest in advanced imaging equipment and the expertise of a board-certified radiologist facilitates accurate diagnosis and allows for the best treatment options whether surgical or medical.



Advanced imaging capabilities include:

- Digital and Computer Enhanced Radiography
- Ultrasound
- Nuclear Scintigraphy Scan
- CT Scan
- Equine-dedicated, high-field Magnetic Resonance Imaging (MRI)
